Improving ICT Infrastructure for Health Care in Uganda

Through the US Government's Emergency Plan for AIDS Relief (PEPFAR) Uganda and other efforts like the Global Health Security Agenda (GHSA) continue to support the Uganda Ministry of Health (MoH) to invest in critical Health Information System (HIS) Infrastructure. Clean and secure information is only possible through robust information systems and the supporting infrastructure. Full-time commitment of 100 solutions is critical for improved health care and disease surveillance.

In Fiscal Year 2022, a centralized procurement approach to acquire and equip health facilities was coordinated with the aim of lowering the overall cost of acquisition. METS was asked to support the procurement and distribution of hardware, working with MoH and partners.

The main goal of the investment is to increase the usage of Point of Care data capture in high-volume ART clinics treating over 500 clients. Point of Care improves workflow and saves time on clinical decision-making while allowing real-time data entry of accurate data while the client is still at the facility.
